

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT DEPOSITING MONEY

- You can only deposit money into the account of a prisoner you are registered to visit.
- If you are registered to visit a particular prisoner, you may deposit money into their account any time during cashier operation hours, except on the days you visit when you must deposit money before your visit .
- On weekends, you can deposit cash through the offices at the front gate only into accounts for the prisoners you are visiting that day, and this must be before the visit.

TRANSPORT TO CASUARINA PRISON

Parking

There is a visitors' parking area at Casuarina Prison.

Public Transport

The closest significant public transport service is Kwinana train station, which is about 5km from the prison.

Visitor Bus Service

The prison runs a visitors' bus service to and from Kwinana train station on Tuesdays, Thursdays, weekends and public holidays. If you need a bus, make sure you tell Visit Bookings when you book a visit and they can make sure your visit coincides with a bus service.

STATUTORY DECLARATIONS AND YOUR VISIT

The prison completes security checks on all visitors before they can visit someone in prison. You need to complete a Statutory Declaration Form when visiting someone in prison for the first time. You will be required to bring identification documents and complete a Statutory Declaration Form at the visitor centre before you enter the prison. You can learn more at www.correctiveservices.wa.gov.au or ask **ReSet** staff about the types of ID you will need to bring.



MAIL

You can send mail to prisoners in two ways:

- 1. Drop it into the mail box** at the **ReSet** Family Visitor Centre. Write the person's name and unit number on the front and the sender's name on the back of the envelope. The centre provides paper and envelopes.
- 2. Send it via Australia Post:**
Post to Casuarina Prison, Locked Bag 1, Kwinana, WA 6966
Restrictions apply to mail contents – check with the Department of Justice for details.

PRISON CASHIER

You can deposit money to prisoners' accounts (via the prison) in four ways:

- 1. Cash and Eftpos transactions** to the prison Cashier.
Open 8:15am–12pm and 1pm–4:15pm Monday to Friday.
- 2. Cash to the prison's Front Gate Senior Officer.**
Weekends and public holidays only – and only if you also have a visit booked.
- 3. Money Order (with your address on the back) by Australia Post.**
Send it to: Attention: The Cashier, [prisoner name],

- 4. Online via the Department of Justice website**
You must be a registered visitor of the prisoner to send money
